Welcome to the PESC!

Welcome to the Point Edward Skating Club, established in 1961, and dedicated to providing an opportunity for youth to participate in skating in a positive, supportive and fun atmosphere led by professional coaching staff to help everyone achieve their personal skating goals.

GREETINGS!

Welcome! We are looking forward to yet another fun and successful skating season here at PESC! We hope everyone had a wonderful summer. Welcome back to our returning skaters and their families and we want to extend a warm welcome to those who will be joining our club for the first time. We pride ourselves on being a club that provides high caliber programming and coaching in a fun and supportive environment for all levels.

Please refer to this brochure for important information regarding the administration of the club, coaching staff, policies, as well as program offerings and fees. **Additionally, please be sure to follow us on Facebook to stay up to date and keep an eye on your email throughout the season as club information will be sent out via email to members at the email account used to create the Uplifter account! We strongly encourage you not to opt out of communications (in Uplifter account settings) as it can cause you to miss important information.**

REGISTRATION [\(back to Table of contents\)](#)

Registration for the 2026-2027 season will be held online utilizing our online software platform Uplifter. **Registration will be live starting at 7:00 pm on Tuesday September 15th**. We will provide links to the online registration on our website at <https://pesc.uplifterinc.com>. To register you (the parent/guardian) will need to create a member account if you do not already have one, so it is recommended to do this prior to September 15th. Once you create an account/log in, you can click on the Participant icon and add your skater(s). Detailed instructions on the registration process can be found on our website. If you require assistance while registering, please contact Tanya, Sonia, or Lindsay (contact information located in this brochure) and we will assist you or direct you to the person who can.

Note that through the Uplifter online registration you will have the ability to pay online at the time of registration utilizing credit card or selecting the e-transfer option. 50% of fees will be due at the time of registration, as has always been our policy, or you can pay the balance in full. If you opt for the 50% option, you will then have the option for instalment payments for any remaining balance. If you cannot pay through using a credit card or e-transfer, we can still accept cheques if absolutely needed, though the online platform is preferred for administrative purposes. We will not be accepting cash for registration this season. If you need to pay by cheque, please contact our treasurer for information on where to deliver the cheque(s).

COACHING STAFF & PRIVATE LESSON FEES [\(back to Table of contents\)](#)

Our club is very fortunate to have highly experienced coaches certified by Skate Canada to provide lessons and guidance to our skaters. Our club is unique in that our coaches work together, as a team, to provide programming for our members so your skater will not be solely taught by one coach.

Our club coaches are paid by the club to provide group lessons (eg. Canskate, Pre-Canskate, some parts of private ice) and these lessons are included in the registration fees. Coaches also use Club ice time to provide private/semi-private lessons to members in addition to the group lessons offered in some programs. Such private/semi-private lessons as well as the associated fees are dependent on the program your skater is enrolled in and are handled between the coach and the parent/guardian directly. If you are unsure about private lesson fees, and whether they apply to your skater(s), please contact Sonia Rivard, our head coach, for clarification.

SKATE WITH AN EDGE! Professional Skate Sharpening/Repair to help keep your edge! Professional figure skate sharpening and repair service will continue to be offered to our Members by Mark Moore. Mark will give you advice on your equipment, plus recommend what you need to get the most out of your skating.

Mark will pick up and deliver your skates back to the arena. **Pick-ups will be on Monday and Wednesday** nights from the arena and will be returned the following day. Skates to be sharpened must have \$20 in an envelope with name and phone number on it and placed in the bins in the coaches' room for pick up. Sharpened skates will be returned to the shelves in the coaches' room. No skates will be sharpened without an envelope with payment and phone number. Cash only at this time please. Mark will also be available by appointment, if needed, at his home. Please text for availability.

WHAT SKATERS NEED / GOOD TO KNOW... [\(back to Table of contents\)](#)

HELMETS

- **CSA approved hockey helmets are MANDATORY** for ALL skaters registered in the Parent and Tot, Pre-Canskate, CanSkate and Starskate programs who have not completed Canskate Stage 5
- The fit should be snug and the strap in good working order with placement under the chin
- **NO BIKE HELMETS OR SNOWBOARDING/OTHER HELMETS ARE PERMITTED**

CLOTHING

- All skaters must come dressed in warm clothing that allows sufficient mobility so as not to impede the skater's motion. Snow pants are not recommended as they can make it difficult for little skaters to get back up after a fall and tend to greatly restrict movement. As an alternative, rain pants are a great way to help little skaters stay dry. We recommend layers to stay warm.
- Warm gloves/mittens should be worn. We highly recommend keeping a spare pair on hand to switch out should your skater's gloves get wet from falls!!

SKATES

- *****Ensure your child's skates fit properly.** Skates should have a proper and snug fit and have solid ankle support to allow skaters to stand straight up. Skates that are either too big or too small can cause the skater's feet and ankles to move in the skates, become painful while skating and pose an injury risk. **It is not advisable to use a size that "they can grow into"** as this will hinder their performance as well as pose **risk of ankle injury**. If you have questions on the fit of your child's skates, please ask any of our club coaches.

FUNDRAISING [\(back to Table of contents\)](#)

Ontario Skaters Promotional Contest Ticket Books - This fundraising initiative helps to support our Club as well as Skate Ontario, and the cost is a required portion of the registration fees. Each family with a skater at the Canskate level or higher

will receive 1 book of tickets (1 booklet per family). The tickets can be sold at the indicated price, and families recoup the fundraising fee paid at registration, or the ticket stubs can simply be filled out and handed in. Information will be provided on ticket stub collection and due dates.

Additional fundraising may be undertaken by the Club, in which case information will be provided to membership.

CLUB REGISTRATION & PAYMENT POLICY [\(back to Table of contents\)](#)

FEES

To participate in registered sessions, competitions, the ice show and tests, member accounts must be in good standing. 50% of the registration total (including applicable fees) is due at Registration, with full payment due by January 15, 2027 if opting for the instalment plan (50% at registration, 25% November 15, 25% January 15).

Payment can be made online through your Uplifter account by credit card, or you can select e-transfer and promptly send payment to ptedsctreasurer@gmail.com being sure to indicate the Skater's name and "registration fees" in the memo. In cases where credit card or online payment is not possible, we will accept cheques payable to "Point Edward Skating Club". Only online payments will be accepted from anyone with more than two NSF cheques. We will not be accepting cash payments for this season.

Please note that if fees are not paid and an account is not in good standing, the member can/will be prevented from participating until fees are paid.

MULTIPLE SKATERS

For families with multiple skaters registered, a discount of \$50 for each added skater will be applied. Please note that the family discount does not apply to skaters in the Powerskate program or 10-week precanskate program (if those are offered in a particular season).

PROGRAM CHANGES

Any changes to registered skating sessions must be discussed with our Head Coach, Sonia Rivard, who can then assist you in selecting alternate sessions. Skaters in our PreCanskate and Canskate programs may reach out to Coach Cindy Oakley. Once approved, program changes can be made online through your Uplifter account with our Club. Instructions will be provided on how to change programming in Uplifter. **If leading up to registration you are unsure what your skater should be registered in, please contact Coach Sonia prior to registering to ensure you are registering your child in the correct program to minimize the need for program changes and to ensure you get into the correct program before it fills up.**

REFUNDS

Requests for refunds will only be considered if received in writing before November 15, 2026, for Private Ice skaters or by November 30, 2026 for PreCanskate/Canskate/Starskate skaters. Requests should be directed to our Treasurer at ptedsctreasurer@gmail.com and please copy pescpresident@gmail.com and pescvicepres@gmail.com. Please note that **Annual Member Fees, fundraising fees and Skate Canada fees are non-refundable.** A \$20 administration fee will be applied to all refunds.

MEDICAL REFUNDS

Partial refunds for skaters who are unable to skate for a minimum of 6 weeks due to medical reasons will be considered by the Board, provided a written request is submitted to our Treasurer at ptedsctreasurer@gmail.com and please copy pescpresident@gmail.com and pescvicepres@gmail.com. In addition to the written request, documentation from a physician confirming the inability to skate due to medical reasons as well as the anticipated duration, must be included.

2026-2027 SEASON ICE SHOW [\(back to Table of contents\)](#)

Show Dates: Saturday Apr. 10th (2:00 & 7:00 pm), & Sunday Apr. 11th (2:00 pm) *(skaters are in all 3 shows)*
Ice Show Picture Day: March 7th - *details and schedule to be provided*

Our annual ice show is the highlight of the season where skaters are able to perform for family and friends together with their skating peers in a show known for its fantastic music, lights, choreography, costumes and most importantly FUN! It is a celebration of all the hard work skaters put in during the season. More information on the Ice Show can be found on our website, will be posted on our social media and on our boards at the rink, and please feel free to ask any Board member about it...we would love to share about it with you!!

Skaters participating in the Ice Show (some may refer to it as Carnival) will be required to purchase the costumes selected by the Club. A \$75 **costume deposit is required at Registration** which will be applied toward the final cost of the costume. Once numbers and groups are known, costumes will be sourced, purchased and final costs determined. The balance of costume fees (final cost less the \$75 deposit) will be posted once known. We aim to keep the costs as low as possible by sourcing many suppliers. Parents are responsible for full payment of remaining fees at time of pickup. **Please note** that additional information may be communicated regarding estimated costs as well as any possible optional fundraiser being considered to reduce costume fees for skaters. Also, skaters keep the costumes after ice show!

During the ice show practice period, ice time will be strictly for ice show practice. No regular skating lessons will be offered. The registration fees for programming covers ice time up to the start of ice show practice, so those not in ice show are not covering ice costs for those in ice show. Leading up to Ice Show, some schedules may change in terms of days/times to ensure ice show groups can all practice together – this will be provided to each group closer to ice show practices. The final rehearsal date for Ice Show is Friday April 9th and a separate schedule will be issued for that day. This will all be communicated closer to the rehearsal day.

Please note for those in ice show, skating days and times for sessions may vary/change in March due to Ice Show practice, so it is important to regularly check the Club website, Facebook page, bulletin board, emails and handouts for specific details.

SKATING PROGRAMS

The following pages provide information on the Club's skating programs being offered for the 2026-2027 season. The programs descriptions listed below are in order of least to greatest skating experience. ***If your skater is new to skating or has little experience, you should consider the Parent & Tot, Pre-Canskate or Canskate options. If you are registering an older child (eg 8-10+) with no prior skating experience, please contact us before registration to discuss the program best suited for your child.***

*****IMPORTANT: Your child's programming should be based on SKILL LEVEL and not age. The ages provided below provide a general average age for those who begin skating from a young age. If your skater has no prior experience and cannot skate unassisted and/or cannot perform basic movements such as getting up after a fall or stopping, they should be registered in the PreCanskate program. Please feel free to reach out if you are unsure.*****

Please refer to the program schedule for the days and fees associated with each program. Please note the Club reserves the right to cancel or change any session due to insufficient registration or due to reasons beyond our control.

PARENT & TOT (generally ages 2-4) *NOT BEING OFFERED FOR THE 2026/2027 SEASON*****

Required Experience: None for the child; adult MUST be able to skate and assist their skater

SKATING PROGRAMS (CONTINUED)

This session provides an opportunity to enjoy teaching your own child to skate with the help of a professional coach on ice providing guidance and encouragement. **Parent or helper must be 18 years or older, able to skate, and must be registered with Skate Canada and pay the Skate Canada fee. Skaters on this session will not participate in the year end Ice Show. Properly fitted CSA approved hockey helmets are required.**

PRE-CANSKATE (generally ages 3-4, age 5-8 with no prior experience)

Required Experience: None

Children are taught through circuits, games and following others, to fall, get up and enjoy their skating experience. Professional Coaches will supervise this program with the help of qualified Program Assistants. No parents or siblings are allowed on the ice. **Properly fitted CSA approved hockey helmets are required.**

ADULT / TEEN RETURN TO SKATE ***NOT BEING OFFERED FOR THE 2026/2027 SEASON***

Required Experience: Prior skating/ability to be self sufficient on the ice

We are offering a chance for teens/adults to get back on the ice in a supervised session. **Skaters must have prior skating experience and be self-sufficient on the ice. NOTE: No lessons are provided in this session,** however club coaches and/or PAs may help guide skaters and offer tips and suggestions. Professional Coaches will supervise this program with the help of qualified Program Assistants. **Properly fitted CSA approved hockey helmets are required.**

CANSKATE (CANSKATE STAGES 1-6) (generally ages 6+, age 5 with prior skating experience)

Required Experience: Completion of Pre-Canskate OR able to stand and get up independently, some movement

The Canskate program offers opportunities for skaters to develop basic skating abilities with the option of taking Skate Canada tests, while earning awards and incentives. A Professional Coach will supervise all sessions with the help of qualified Program Assistants. Each session will be comprised of a warm-up period, a teaching component, a review and a cool-down period. Children will be assessed frequently and progress at their own rate. The Club recommends skaters choose the 2-day/week option in order to progress faster. **Properly fitted CSA approved hockey helmets required for Stages 1-5.**

STARSKATE (CANSKATE STAGES 5 & 6) (generally age 6+, prior skating experience)

Experience: Successfully passed Canskate Stage 4

This session provides a session similar to private ice on Tuesdays and a group session (similar to Canskate group format) on Fridays with a Professional Coach running the program, assisted by qualified Program Assistants will allow skaters to receive an introduction to the next stage of figure skating, which is the Star Program. One of the club coaches will circulate among the skaters offering instruction with an amount of time set aside to practice. **Properly fitted CSA approved hockey helmets are required up to and including Canskate Level 5.**

INTRODUCTION TO FIGURE SKATING / STAR 1 (CANSKATE STAGE 6)

Experience: Successfully passed Canskate Stage 5

This program is being offered as a transition into the Star program (private ice). It offers an excellent opportunity for skaters to take part in a Star 1 (private ice) session that mimics a Jr private ice session on Tuesday, as well as an Open Freeskate session that will be guided by club coaches on Fridays, thus getting exposure to the shift to Jr Private Ice. This Program has been designed to help both skaters and parents transition to private ice and away from Canskate/Starskate group sessions. If you would like more information on this session, or to find out if it is a good fit for your skater, please reach out to Sonia Rivard.

SKATING PROGRAMS (CONTINUED)

STAR PROGRAM (PRIVATE ICE)

Skating in the Star program is the next step to take after Canskate/STARSkate Stages 5 & 6.

The Star Program levels are as follows:

Star 1-2	Junior
Star 3-4	Intermediate
Star 5-Gold	Senior <u>(***must have completed Star 4 Freeskate assessment – to register in the Senior packages)</u>

Although not required, many skaters in the Star program compete in several competitions throughout the season, and work on a skating program to showcase their skills.

Please note that **skaters registered in the Star Program will receive private or semi-private coaching lessons from our coaches during their scheduled skating sessions.** The length of the coaching sessions will vary, but typically range from 10-20 minutes per session, and coaching staff will schedule all sessions. Coaching will focus on the applicable spins, skills, dances and jumps, and it is a **mandatory** component for Star program skaters.

PLEASE NOTE: Coaching fees for the above-noted private or semi-private lessons are in addition to the package registration fee, and Coaches issue invoices for payment to the skater's family on a regular basis. Payment for coaching fees is due upon receipt and is to be given to the coach directly (cash, cheque or e-transfer). **IMPORTANT: Failure to pay coaching fees in a timely manner will result in the skater no longer being allowed to skate during the sessions he/she is registered in. Fees are non-refundable.**

SPIN SESSIONS: Coaching fee is **not** included in the package fee.

STROKING: Group coaching is included in the package fee.

POWER SKATING *****NOT BEING OFFERED FOR THE 2026/2027 SEASON*****

We will not be offering Power Skating for the 2026-2027 season.

NOTE ON COSTS/NUMBER OF SESSIONS:

PRECANSKATE

The Wednesday cost is slightly higher than the Saturday cost to reflect a differing number of sessions due to holidays, or special events resulting in no skating.

CANSKATE COST

The difference in cost between the Wednesday, Friday, and Saturday options is to reflect a differing number of sessions due to holidays, or special events resulting in no skating.

EXTRA SKATING TIME FOR THOSE CHOSING TO SKATE IN ICE SHOW

The final week of skating for those not opting to participate in our year end ice show is the week of March 1st-6th. Registration fees for all programming covers skating from the beginning of the season to the last week of regular skating. For those opting to participate in our year end ice show on April 10th and 11th, you will continue to skate until ice show, but sessions will transition to ice show practices and will not be structured lessons. Apart from costume costs and tickets for the shows, there are no additional ice fees for those who opt to skate in the ice show and continue to skate.
